## needs to follow instructions:

- **Temperature**: A fever is defined as a temperature of **100° F or more**. The child may return **24** hours after the fever has abated without medicine.
- **Vomiting**: The child may return **48** hours after vomiting has stopped.
- Diarrhea:
  - 1. All cases of diarrhea must be reported to the Center and the cause must be explained. The risks of spreading diarrhea are more serious than the risks of spreading colds. The child may return **48** hours after the diarrhea stops.
  - 2. Diarrhea accompanied by: fever of **100° F**, excessive runny nose and/or irritability.
  - 3. More than 3 diarrhea bowl movements within 8 hours (regardless of the cause).
- Hand, Foot, Mouth Disease: The child may return after fever subsides and sores disappear. This may differ from the Santa Clara County's policy regarding this disease in order to further protect our children and families.
- Head Lice: The child may return after treatment and the nits (egg pockets) are cleared completely from the hair. This may differ from the Santa Clara County's policy regarding this disease in order to further protect our children and families.
- Pink Eye (Conjunctivitis): Children may return to school when the infection is cleared.
- Non-Contagious Bacterial Infection: The child may attend the Center if he/she is feeling well enough to\_participate in classroom activities. Non-contagious bacterial infections include <u>ear infections</u>, <u>sinusitis or bronchitis</u>.
